

Standing Updates

Bed Registry and Referral System

O 211 Press 4 has moved to become the centralized resource for hospitals in need of additional patient care coordination support for accessing inpatient or outpatient/ community-based behavioral health resources. Training and messaging is being developed to support this shift to a centralized resource and will begin to be deployed throughout the remainder of December and into the new calendar year.

• Crisis System Development: Maryland Crisis System Workgroup (12/5/22)

 BHA is working with MDH and state partners to develop a process for law enforcement officers to utilize crisis stabilization centers as a resource for people in crisis. On December 15th, BHA staff will be participating with the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth and Victim Services Center of Excellence.

• Peer and MA Reimbursement

- A Registered Peer Supervisor webinar has been developed to provide program supervisors
 with the knowledge, skills, and abilities that are required to become certified as an RPS in
 Maryland. Having an RPS on staff will be a requirement for all programs submitting claims
 for Certified Peer Recovery services through MA effective September 2023. This webinar
 will be available to providers starting January 1, 2023 using BHA's Online Training Portal
 via bhatrainings.health.maryland.gov/
- Additional Provider Meetings/Trainings are being planned in partnership with MA and the behavioral health administrative service organization (BHASO). These meetings will be scheduled for the end of January or early February.

Public Awareness Activities

BHA launched the Trained Military Assistance Provider (TMAP) Program, a new initiative to reduce suicides and increase lethal-means safety for service members and veterans. Developed by the Maryland Governor's Challenge to Prevent Suicide Among Service Members, Veterans and their Families, this training is free to all Maryland-based primary care staff. The initiative was first launched as a pilot program in 10 Maryland primary care practices. Participants are trained on mental health, suicide risk assessment and intervention. The curriculum helps providers better understand military and veteran culture, and create a safety plan in a military-culturally competent way.

TMAP offers 3.5 hours of online training, over 10 self-paced courses on topics including:

- Military culture
- Safety planning
- Barriers to care
- Lethal means counseling
- Risk assessment tools

Once completed, providers will become "Trained Military Assistance Providers" and will receive a physical and a virtual toolkit with resources, including gun locks, locking medicine bags, as well as promotional materials. Learn more or access the training: bit.ly/MDHTMAP.
