Effective June 1, 2023, Maryland Medicaid will reimburse opioid treatment programs (OTPs) and community-based substance use disorder (SUD) programs licensed by the Behavioral Health Administration for peer recovery support services rendered by Certified Peer Recovery Specialists (CPRS).

Peer recovery support service is the provision of non-clinical activities by individuals in recovery from behavioral health concerns, including substance use disorders or mental health concerns, who use their personal, lived experiences and training to support other individuals with substance use disorders. Services may include, but are not limited to:

- Participation in the development of a recipient's recovery plan;
- Supporting recipient through goal-setting and skill-building;
- Providing culturally competent care;
- Facilitating peer support groups; and
- Providing referrals and connections to crisis services, community-based supports, or other medically necessary services on a need basis.

## **Provider Requirements**

Medicaid will reimburse peer recovery support services provided by eligible Community-based

Substance Use Disorder Programs licensed under COMAR 10.63.03 by the Behavioral Health Administration (BHA) as:

- Outpatient Level 1, Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP) Level 2.1, and/or Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP) Level 2.5 (Medicaid Provider Type 50)
- Opioid Treatment Programs (Medicaid Provider Type 32)

To be eligible for Medicaid reimbursement, peer recovery support services must be rendered by a Certified Peer Recovery Specialist (CPRS) who is certified by the Maryland Addictions and Behavioral-health Professionals Certification Board (MABPCB). CPRS staff must be supervised by a registered peer supervisor (RPS) approved by the MABPCB. To allow time for supervisors to obtain their necessary certification, a non-RPS supervisor may temporarily serve as the peer supervisor from **June 1, 2023 through August 31, 2023** if they are a board-approved supervisor who is either a licensed mental health practitioner defined in COMAR 10.09.59.04A or a certified alcohol and drug counselor. All CPRS staff must be supervised by a RPS on or after September 1, 2023.

## **Reimbursement Methodology**

## **Provider Enrollment**

Providers must enroll with Maryland Medicaid for this specific service to become eligible for Medicaid reimbursement. Existing Medicaid-enrolled Provider Types 32 and 50 will need to complete a supplemental application via ePREP and provide the following:

- Provider Type specific addenda with the completed attestation for peer recovery support services:
- Copy of peer certifications for all employed peers who will render this service;
- Documentation for the peer supervisor, which includes either a copy of the Registered Peer Supervisor certification; or the credentials for a licensed mental health practitioner or certified drug and alcohol counselor who is approved to supervise by their relevant licensing board<sup>1</sup>; and
- Pre-employment background check results for each certified peer and supervisor

<sup>1</sup>On and after September 1, 2023 all peers must be supervised by a Registered Peer Supervisor. Providers who have a previously approved application with a non-RPS supervisor will be required to submit a new supplemental application to document compliance with the RPS supervision requirement.

Interested providers not yet enrolled with Medicaid will need to complete a new application via ePREP and include the above.
