News and Reminders

1. Maryland Overdose Data Dashboard

Maryland has a new tool for combating the opioid crisis. The new **Overdose Data Dashboard** was created with extensive feedback from community partners about what they need to respond quickly to trends and save lives. Visit the Dashboard at bit.ly/OverdoseData.

2. Maternal Opioid Misuse (MOM) Program

The Maternal Opioid Misuse (MOM) Program was created to provide case management services to pregnant enrollees with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) that will continue for one year following the end of pregnancy. The program's success requires providers to encourage patients who qualify to enroll.

We have created a toolkit that contains all informational resources for the MOM Program. Providing support to pregnant Medicaid members diagnosed with OUD will ensure access to proper healthcare for participants and their families. Learn more and access the MOM Case Management Toolkit.
